


## Summer-themed Activity: **Tropical Fish Craft**



### Materials:

1. Paper Plate
2. Scissors
3. Stapler
4. Colored Tissue Paper
5. White Glue
6. Wiggle Eyes (optional)



### Directions:

1. To make your fish, first cut a wedge/triangle out of your plate.



2. Now glue or staple your cut out triangle to the plate, to give it the look of a fish tail.



3. Cut or tear your tissue paper into squares.

Use as many colors as you'd like!



4. Cover the plate in a thin layer of glue and place the squares of tissue paper on the plate in any design or pattern you want. (Feel free to add more glue if needed.)

5. It is okay to add a top layer of glue to the fish and let it dry to protect the tissue paper.



6. Glue your large wiggly eyes on your fish. If you don't have wiggly eyes, draw your own with a writing utensil like a marker or pencil.
